RESEARCH STUDIES PROGRAM

Since its foundation in 1987, PASSIA has undertaken its Research Studies Program. To date, this program has resulted in over 200 publications researched and written by PASSIA team members or by specifically contracted researchers. Over the years, our authors have been as diverse as the subjects covered. They have included Palestinian, Arab, Israeli and international academics, scholars and experts.

In its efforts to provide background information, in-depth studies, and documentation on issues of concern as well as to promote a better understanding of the Palestinian cause, PASSIA maintains that all research and publishing are done within the context of academic freedom. PASSIA publications aim to be specialized, scientific and objective, yet they often address controversial or neglected issues and allow the expression of a wide range of perspectives.

PASSIA is proud that its publications have become a valuable reference source for academics, diplomats, professionals, libraries and anyone with an interest in Palestinian issues and their relations to regional and international affairs.

Shrinking Space in Palestinian Neighborhoods- Israel Efforts to Consolidate Control in East Jerusalem

English, 24 pages, October 2022

This bulletin provides an overview of the various Palestinian neighborhoods that make up East Jerusalem, describes their current situation, including available statistics, and shows how Israeli policies affect them due to settlement (expansion/enclaves) and other activities and plans.



INTRODUCTION

For the past 55 years of its occupation, Israel and the Jerusalem Municipality have implemented laws and practices which contradict international law and prevent Palestinians to develop East Jerusalem according to their needs. Palestinians are not granted building permits for housing, schools, tourist infrastructure, and others, while Israel's continuous settlement building prevents a natural urban development for Palestinians - all in an attempt to push them out of the city and contain their number at its 1967 ratio.¹ The neglect of East Jerusalem and Israel's discriminatory policies against Palestinians have led to severe overcrowding and economic hardship. Nevertheless, Palestinians are determined to fight for their right to live in Jerusalem as provided for by international law, even though the socioeconomic situation and Israel's policy to prevent family reunions are forcing many to move towards the city's cheaper outskirts.

Today, two-thirds of the Palestinian Jerusalemites live in neighborhoods within the limits of the Israeli Jerusalem Municipality and "inside" the separation barrier, while a third - some 120,000-140,000 people - live in overcrowded areas within the municipal border, but cut off from the city by the separation barrier (Ruffi Agab, Shu'fat Refugee Camp) with no services and little law enforcement but affordable housing. Other neighborhoods - such as Anata, Sawrah, Wajaja - lie partially within the municipal limits and partially in the West Bank.

However, there are several issues all the neighborhoods have in common to varying extents. They all:

- face **discriminatory planning rights** and have hardly any land reserves;
- suffer from **infrastructure neglect, acute housing shortages, overcrowding, and the threat of home demolition** - either for lacking permits or for being located too close to settlements or the separation barrier;
- are subject to **continuous confiscation of land** for the expansion of settlements or creation of state-backed settler enclaves (isolated houses, apartments or compounds) in their midst;
- are exposed to an **Israeli roads and transportation system**, including the Eastern Ring Road and the light rail train, that only serves Israel's interests by promoting territorial continuity for its settlements while fragmenting Palestinian neighborhoods;

¹ According to Israel records, the city's 1967 ratio was 25.0% Palestinians and 74.3% Jews and the 1973 ministerial 'Gahal Commission' stipulated that a demographic balance be maintained at a ratio of 30.7%. However, at the end of 2019, the Palestinian ratio had reached 38.3%.

² E.g. in 2019, the District Planning Committee had plans for 21,450 housing units in Jerusalem Israeli neighborhoods and settlements but only 2,000 units in Palestinian neighborhoods. In 2020, the Committee advanced detailed outline plans for 12,672 housing units, of which only 1,142 (or 9%) were for Palestinians. 'Government Decision 3789' - a plan to remove socioeconomic disparities in the city, does not provide for Palestinian residential development needs or preparation of outline plans in their neighborhoods. DIALOGUE PROGRAM

From its outset, PASSIA's Dialogue Program has striven to promote free expression within Palestinian society and to foster a better understanding of Palestinian affairs, be they in the domestic or international context. In providing a forum for dialogue and exchange, PASSIA has been serving as a catalyst for civic debate.

Central to these efforts has been the presentation and analysis of a plurality of Palestinian perspectives and approaches on a wide range of subjects broadly related to the Palestine Question – whether through roundtable meetings, briefings or media appearances. As part of the former, speakers are invited (and sometimes a discussant as well) to lecture on a certain topic, followed by a discussion with the audience present. These **roundtable meetings** aim to promote thought and debate among Palestinians and between Palestinians and their foreign counterparts. In order to accommodate a larger audience attending those meetings 'public lectures', most of them take place in hotel halls (in Jerusalem or Ramallah). Speakers, discussants and participants usually include local and foreign figures from a variety of backgrounds and schools of thought: scholars, professionals, officials and intellectuals from Palestine, Israel and abroad; members of Palestinian NGOs, political factions and the media, as well as representatives of diplomatic missions.

PASSIA **briefings** are a venue for encounters, dialogue and discussions involving representatives and organizations from various backgrounds. Briefings typically focus on current Palestinian affairs and are designed to build bridges of communication and understanding between Palestinians from different streams of society and to develop constructive and focused academic contact between Palestinians and their counterparts. They include meetings in which resident diplomats, visiting foreign delegations or student groups from international universities discuss Palestinian affairs and exchange thoughts and opinions concerning the situation in the Palestinian Territories.

Media appearances are encounters with resident and visiting correspondents and journalists, mostly in the form of interviews.

PASSIA also receives invitations to meetings with diplomats and visiting foreign dignitaries at other venues helping to consolidate relationships and forge connections between Palestinians and their foreign counterparts.

PROTECTING ISLAMIC AND CHRISTIAN CULTURAL HERITAGE IN JERUSALEM

This three-year project is jointly implemented by PalVision, PASSIA and ACT, and funded by the EU. It aims to develop and support the Palestinian East Jerusalem community and civil society's role in safeguarding their Islamic and Christian cultural heritage which is an integral part of the city's Palestinian identity. This will contribute to the strengthening of the overall resilience of Palestinian Jerusalemites and the preservation of the city's Palestinian character and support the historical, archaeological and cultural narrative that represents a true reflection of the city's Arab character. The Islamic and Christian Waqf properties play thereby a particularly important role and are in urgent need for protection due to Israel's ongoing attempts to monopolize Jerusalem's history and culture with its own ethnoreligious legacy.

The project's overall objective is to contribute to preserving the Palestinian character and cultural heritage of East Jerusalem by strengthening the Palestinian identity and enhancing the sense of belonging among Palestinians. More specifically, it aims at protecting Islamic and Christian religious and cultural heritage properties, including "Waqf", against Israeli violations and threats, as well as at enhancing Palestinians' ability to identify and value their cultural heritage and understand what can be done to protect it and the role it plays in preserving the Palestinian character of the city.

TRAINING SEMINARS

As part of the "Protecting Islamic and Christian Culture in Jerusalem" project and building on its longstanding work in and on Jerusalem, PASSIA organized three training seminars to enhance the capacity and effectiveness of young Palestinians to successfully engage in digital advocacy, media and public awareness activities against the background of their threatened religious and cultural heritage in Jerusalem. The courses provided participants with the knowledge, tools and skills to develop advocacy goals, strategies and campaigns for use at local and international levels.

Candidates interested in the training seminars had to fill-in the E-application form. Upon selection, participants had to confirm their commitment to full-time participation. There were no costs involved for the participants.

The PASSIA training programs – one on *Digital Advocacy* and two on *Visualizing and Documenting Heritage Using Photography* - took place in March, June and July 2022 respectively. Certificates were awarded to participants who successfully completed the program.



As part of the overall project, PASSIA engages in various research activities, including an in-depth monograph entitled *The Islamic Waqf in Jerusalem: Status, Legal Challenges and Possibilities for Revival* by Dr. Haitham Suleiman from the Faculty of Law at Al-Quds University. The book explores the conflict over Waqf properties in Jerusalem within both a context of postcolonial legal pluralism and the framework of a specific topic, i.e., property



confiscation by the Israeli regime, which, among other things, leaves Palestinians with no legal authority over the administration of the waqf system. Recent legal disputes over the status of certain mosques and cemeteries (as waqf properties), and the special situation of waqf property in Jerusalem are examined as sites of Palestinian resistance.

Another part of the research component is an ongoing documentation of Israeli violations against Al-Aqsa Mosque and other Islamic and Christian cultural heritage sites in Jerusalem. This detailed chronology is updated on a regular basis and accessible on PASSIA's website (<http://passia.org/wptimeline/>).

A ***Bibliography on the Islamic and Christian Waqf Endowment in Jerusalem*** was published in March 2022 under the project. It presents a comprehensive list of English and Arabic language sources – the latter in a transliterated format – that facilitates and guides the study of the waqf in Jerusalem. It is meant to serve as a reference bibliography of primary and secondary scholarly resources, including books, articles, studies, and dissertations, dealing with the history, evolution, and functions of the institution of the Waqf in Jerusalem.

FOSTERING YOUNG PALESTINIAN JERUSALEMITES ACTIVE CITIZENSHIP TOWARDS MEANINGFUL CIVIL AND POLITICAL PARTICIPATION

This project was developed against the background of the living conditions in East Jerusalem which create a context that leaves little perspective for the Palestinians in general and the youth in particular. In addition, while youth constitute a major share of the society and while there is a range of organizations in Jerusalem dedicated to youth work or targeting youth in one way or another, they hardly appear as civic actors and are barely represented in decision-making processes.

Thus, Palestinian youth and young adults living in East Jerusalem do not currently use their potential as active citizens and there still a major gap between desired and actual participation. Past initiatives that started promising in their attempts to achieving a more inclusive and participatory political role proved short-lived and faded away. Given the fact that today's youth are the future, there is an urgent need to counter this trend.

Identifying the barriers and obstacles to participation is a prerequisite for a meaningful engagement of young people. The goal of the project is thus to explore the physical, social, cultural and political barriers to youth participation and engagement, particularly within the special context of Jerusalem, and look into the kind of interventions needed to overcome these.

In achieving this, the project will:

- Provide a forum where youth can share perspectives in constructive dialogue;
- Facilitate discussion among youth on issues that affect their social, legal, economic and political status;
- Increase the ability of youth to understand and claim their rights as well as advocate for social change in their local communities.

Activities under this project include an initial **SWOT analysis workshop** to identify the potential as well as the main barriers to youth’s participation and engagement, followed by **structured dialogue** (focus group meetings) to further elaborate on the principles of youth inclusion and empowerment to identify entry points for enhanced youth engagement. In addition, there will be questionnaire-based interviews with key informants and youth to gain additional insights into the experiences of those who are involved in community work involving youth.

At a later stage, there will be a set of training programs on specific skills required for proper participation and a youth-led conference on the subjects examined in this project as well as recommendation of where to go from here.

PASSIA DESK DIARY


At the end of 2022, PASSIA published the 35th edition of its annual Desk Diary! As in previous years, the goal was to provide a comprehensive “tool” for all those who work in or on Palestine or are interested in the Palestine Question in which way ever. As every year, the current edition was updated, amended and revised according to new information that had become available throughout the year. On over 370 pages, the PASSIA Desk Diary contains a directory of contact information for relevant organizations operating in the West Bank and Gaza (listing names, addresses, main activities), as well as a full day-to-day planner (calendar) for the year, and a comprehensive compilation of facts and figures related to Palestine and the Palestinians. PASSIA is very proud to say that its diary has become an invaluable source of information for many people, both locally and abroad, and as yet there is no equivalent publication in Palestine.

The PASSIA Diary is divided into three sections - the Calendar, the Directory, and the Agenda:



Calendar

The first section of the Diary includes all the standard features of a calendar, such as a day by-day planner, calendars for the previous and following years, address and note space, and anniversaries and national holidays of foreign countries. In each calendar page, the 2023 edition includes informative textboxes on Palestinian Journalists killed by Israel.



Directory:

This part of the Diary contains the Directory listing Palestinian and international institutions operating in Palestine as well as selected Arab and Israeli organizations located in Israel. Entries include names of contact persons, phone and fax numbers, e-mail and mailing addresses, websites, and a few keywords describing an organization's main field of work. 
