RESEARCH STUDIES PROGRAM

Since its foundation in 1987, PASSIA has undertaken its Research Studies Program. To date, this program has resulted in over 200 publications researched and written by PASSIA team members or by specifically contracted researchers. Over the years, our authors have been as diverse as the subjects covered. They have included Palestinian, Arab, Israeli and international academics, scholars and experts.

In its efforts to provide background information, in-depth studies, and documentation on issues of concern as well as to promote a better understanding of the Palestinian cause, PASSIA maintains that all research and publishing are done within the context of academic freedom. PASSIA publications aim to be specialized, scientific and objective, yet they often address controversial or neglected issues and allow the expression of a wide range of perspectives.

PASSIA is proud that its publications have become a valuable reference source for academics, diplomats, professionals, libraries and anyone with an interest in Palestinian issues and their relations to regional and international affairs.

As part of its 2021 Research Program, PASSIA published two bulletins, one on *The 2021 Palestinian Elections That Never Happened* and one on *The Palestinian Security Sector*. In addition, an Arabic translation of the PASSIA bulletin on was printed. (For additional publications see chapter on *Protecting Islamic and Christian Cultural Heritage in Jerusalem*).

The 2021 Palestinian Elections – That Never Happened

English and Arabic, 32 pages, September 2021

After 15 election-less years in the Occupied Palestinian Territories (OPT) and many failed attempts at intra-Palestinian reconciliation, it seemed as though the long overdue Palestinian general elections would finally take place in 2021. Such hope was dashed for the time being after President Mahmoud Abbas announced its indefinite postponement. This bulletin tells the story of the 2021 election promise, its process, actors, agendas, and premature ending.



Israeli (Government) Institutions and Their Impact on Palestinians in East Jerusalem

Arabic, 24 pages, September 2021

This is the Arabic translation of a 2020 bulletin which attempts to give an overview of the landscape of Israeli institutions with which ordinary Palestinians are forced to deal with in their daily lives in East Jerusalem, over which Israel claims de jure sovereignty, and show how they are de facto structurally disadvantaged by the activities of these institutions.



The Palestinian Security Sector

English and Arabic, 24 pages, November 2021

While “security arrangements” were one of the issues deferred to the permanent status negotiations, the Oslo Accords provided for a “strong police force” to maintain public order and internal security in the Palestinian territories. Since then, the Palestinian forces have undergone numerous reform processes in line with political developments and changes in leadership and security policies, but the focus remained on law and order in the PA areas and on the assurance of Israeli - rather than Palestinian - security, thus creating a major potential for conflict from the outset.

This bulletin seeks to provide a comprehensive overview of the origins and evolution as well as current structure and roles of the Palestinian Authority Security Forces (PASF). It provides facts and figures as well as public perceptions of the PASF’s performance and the role of international actors.



Looking ahead, the bulletin also addresses the prospects for the continued sustainability of the PASF and what needs to be done to maintain and increase their efficiency and public legitimacy as well as formalize a much-needed national security doctrine.

JERUSALEM

The Question of Jerusalem remained a focus of PASSIA's activities during 2021, including hosting meetings, conducting academic research, providing documentation, publication and cooperation with other institutions.

RESEARCH & PUBLICATION

PASSIA's ongoing research on Jerusalem includes the **documentation of events** in or related to the city, which is regularly updated and published on PASSIA's website. Besides factsheets and articles, this primarily includes a detailed chronology, listing Israeli rights violations such as home demolitions, land confiscations, assaults, and arrests, as well as political decisions, meetings, statements by local and international stakeholders, and related matters, thus making key information easily accessible for everyone interested in studying or tracing a specific past event that occurred in the city of Jerusalem.

The Religious Studies Unit, which was established in 1998 after realizing the increasing need for a better understanding of religious issues and the various religious communities, promotes inter-faith dialogue and activities, dealing chiefly with the causes and consequences of problems within and between the religious communities as well as the political repercussions of religious conflict.

DIALOGUE PROGRAM

From its outset, PASSIA's Dialogue Program has striven to promote free expression within Palestinian society and to foster a better understanding of Palestinian affairs, be they in the domestic or international context. In providing a forum for dialogue and exchange, PASSIA has been serving as a catalyst for civic debate.

Central to these efforts has been the presentation and analysis of a plurality of Palestinian perspectives and approaches on a wide range of subjects broadly related to the Palestine Question – whether through roundtable meetings, briefings or media appearances. As part of the former, speakers are invited (and sometimes a discussant as well) to lecture on a certain topic, followed by a discussion with the audience present. These **roundtable meetings** aim to promote thought and debate among Palestinians and between Palestinians and their foreign counterparts. In order to accommodate a larger audience attending those meetings 'public lectures', most of them take place in hotel halls (in Jerusalem or Ramallah). Speakers, discussants and participants usually include local and foreign figures from a variety of backgrounds and schools of thought: scholars, professionals, officials and intellectuals from Palestine, Israel and abroad; members of Palestinian NGOs, political factions and the media, as well as representatives of diplomatic missions.

PASSIA **briefings** are a venue for encounters, dialogue and discussions involving representatives and organizations from various backgrounds. Briefings typically focus on current Palestinian affairs and are designed to build bridges of communication and understanding between Palestinians from different streams of society and to develop constructive and focused academic contact between Palestinians and their counterparts. They include meetings in which resident diplomats, visiting foreign delegations or student groups from international universities discuss Palestinian affairs and exchange thoughts and opinions concerning the situation in the Palestinian Territories.

Media appearances are encounters with resident and visiting correspondents and journalists, mostly in the form of interviews.

PASSIA also receives invitations to meetings with diplomats and visiting foreign dignitaries at other venues helping to consolidate relationships and forge connections between Palestinians and their foreign counterparts.

All meetings were attended by Dr. Mahdi Abdul Hadi, Head of PASSIA. 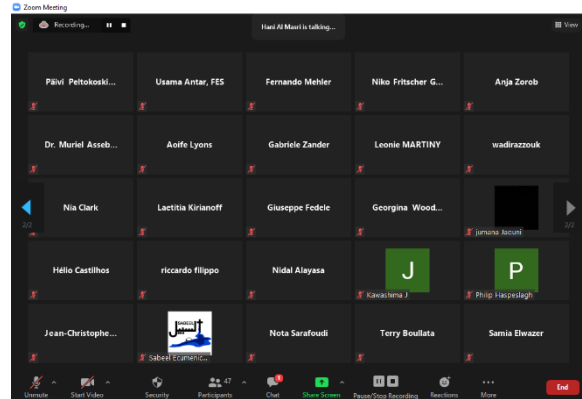

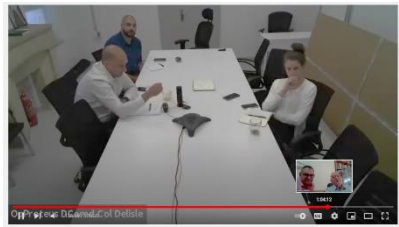

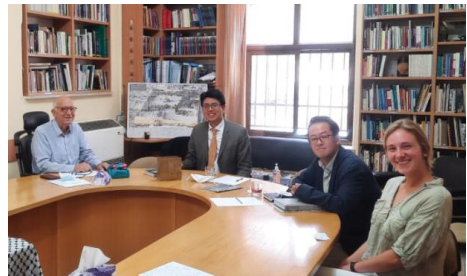

PROTECTING ISLAMIC AND CHRISTIAN CULTURAL HERITAGE IN JERUSALEM

This three-year project is jointly implemented by PalVision, PASSIA and ACT, and funded by the EU. It aims to develop and support the Palestinian East Jerusalem community and civil society's role in safeguarding their Islamic and Christian cultural heritage which is an integral part of the city's Palestinian identity. This will contribute to the strengthening of the overall resilience of Palestinian Jerusalemites and the preservation of the city's Palestinian character and support the historical, archaeological and cultural narrative that represents a true reflection of the city's Arab character. The Islamic and Christian Waqf properties play thereby a particularly important role and are in urgent need for protection due to Israel's ongoing attempts to monopolize Jerusalem's history and culture with its own ethnoreligious legacy.

The project's overall objective is to contribute to preserving the Palestinian character and cultural heritage of East Jerusalem by strengthening the Palestinian identity and enhancing the sense of belonging among Palestinians. More specifically, it aims at protecting Islamic and Christian religious and cultural heritage properties, including "Waqf", against Israeli violations and threats, as well as at enhancing Palestinians' ability to identify and value their cultural heritage and understand what can be done to protect it and the role it plays in preserving the Palestinian character of the city.

Based on the notion that local stakeholders and the community play a vital role in protecting national heritage and identity, the course provided participants with knowledge on Jerusalem's identity-shaping cultural and religious heritage and equipped them with skills to preserve and promote this heritage at local and international levels. This training was part of the "Protecting Islamic and Christian Cultural Heritage in Jerusalem" project which is jointly implemented by PalVision, PASSIA and ACT, and funded by the EU.

Upon selection, participants had to confirm their commitment to full-time participation in writing. The program itself took place from 21-23 February 2021 & 1 March 2021. Due to the situation caused by the Coronavirus pandemic, the course was partly conducted online, i.e., those participants, who could not make it to Jerusalem in person, joined via Zoom. There were no costs involved for the participants.

Training Program on “Advocacy, Communication and Planning Skills” Legacy Hotel, Jerusalem | November 2021

This course provided participants with the knowledge, tools and skills to develop advocacy goals, strategies and campaigns for use at local and international levels. This training was part of the "Protecting Islamic and Christian Culture in Jerusalem" project which is jointly implemented by Palestinian Vision Organization, PASSIA and ACT, and funded by the EU. The Training Program took place from 10-13 November 2021 at the Legacy Hotel in Jerusalem.

Course Outline

- ***Intensive Seminar.*** During the four-day seminar, key issues, concepts and practices of advocacy & lobbying, planning, and communication were introduced, focusing on the need to protect Palestinian culture and heritage in Jerusalem. The program included:
 - Islamic & Christian Cultural Heritage in Jerusalem
 - Effective Communication Skills
 - Analyzing the Context for Advocacy
 - Identifying Target Audiences & Messages
 - Advocacy Methods & Skills
 - Digital Advocacy (social media, new technologies)
 - Planning Campaigns
 - Case studies & field visit

Candidates interested in the training seminar had to complete and return PASSIA’s E-application forms by the given deadline. Upon selection, participants had to confirm their commitment to full-time participation in writing. The PASSIA Training Program itself took place from 10-13 November 2021 at the Legacy Hotel in Jerusalem. There were no costs involved for the participants.

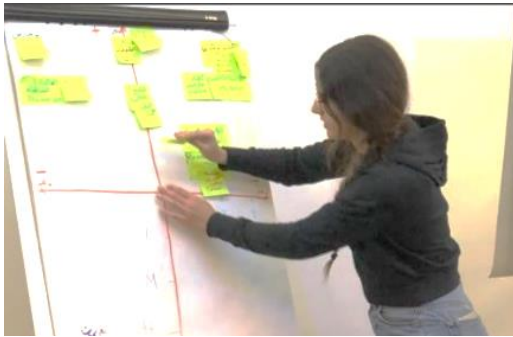

RESEARCH & PUBLICATIONS

As part of the overall project, PASSIA engages in various research activities, including an in-depth monograph entitled *The Islamic Waqf in Jerusalem: Status, Legal Challenges and Possibilities for Revival* (forthcoming 2022) by Dr. Haitham Suleiman from the Faculty of Law at Al-Quds University. The book explores the conflict over Waqf properties in Jerusalem within both a context of postcolonial legal pluralism and the framework of a specific topic, i.e., property confiscation by the Israeli regime, which, among other things, leaves Palestinians with no legal authority over the administration of the waqf system. Recent legal disputes over the status of certain mosques and cemeteries (as waqf properties), and the special situation of waqf property in Jerusalem are examined as sites of Palestinian resistance.

Another part of the research component is an ongoing documentation of **Israeli violations** against Al-Aqsa Mosque and other Islamic and Christian cultural heritage sites in Jerusalem. This detailed chronology is updated on a regular basis and accessible on PASSIA's website (<http://passia.org/wptimeline/>).

Work also continued on a **Bibliography on the Islamic and Christian Waqf Endowment in Jerusalem** (forthcoming 2022) which aims to present a comprehensive list of English and Arabic language sources – the latter in a transliterated format – that facilitates and guides the study of the waqf in Jerusalem. It is meant to serve as a reference bibliography of primary and secondary scholarly resources, including books, articles, studies, and dissertations, dealing with the history, evolution, and functions of the institution of the Waqf in Jerusalem.

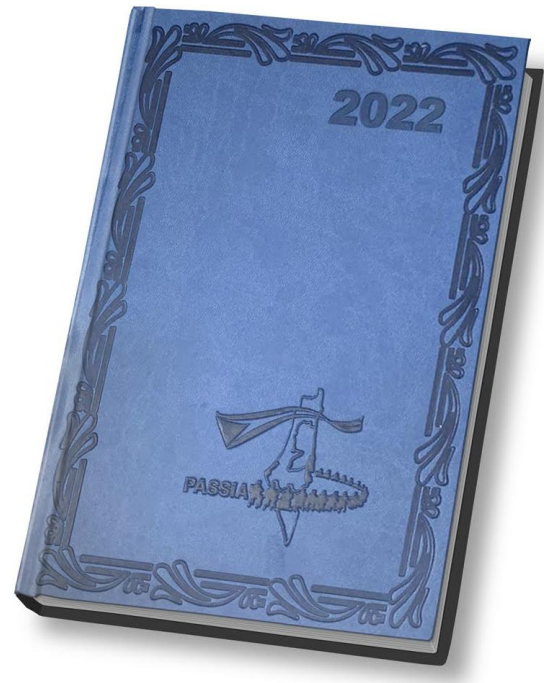
In addition, a small **database** of relevant local, regional and international religious and heritage-oriented organizations has been compiled to be used for advocacy purposes and in order to keep interested parties informed about the project's products and campaigns.

In 2021 PASSIA also published two educational materials:

One is an infographic on *The Islamic Waqf and Al-Aqsa Mosque Affairs* that intends to help local and international stakeholders and others interested in the issue to navigate the environment in which the Waqf is operating. It does so by clarifying and visualizing the role and interrelations of the various bodies that make up "the Waqf" - Waqf Department and Waqf Council - including its connection with the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan in its capacity as the custodian of the holy places in Jerusalem, as well as its relation to other related institutions such as Al-Aqsa Mosque, the Mufti, and the Higher Islamic Council. The Waqf infographic was designed and printed in both English and Arabic and an electronic version is available on PASSIA website.

PASSIA DESK DIARY

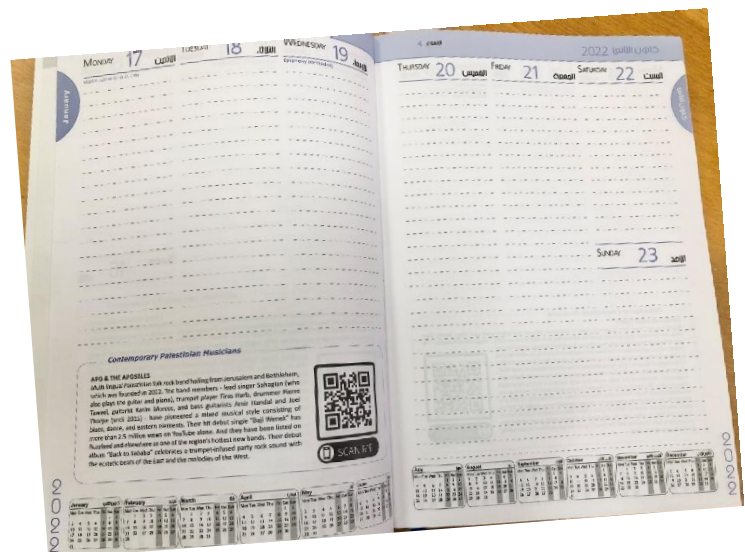
At the end of 2021, PASSIA published the 34th edition of its annual Desk Diary! As in previous years, the goal was to provide a comprehensive “tool” for all those who work in or on Palestine or are interested in the Palestine Question in which way ever. As every year, the current edition was updated, amended and revised according to new information that had become available throughout the year. On over 370 pages, the PASSIA Desk Diary contains a directory of contact information for relevant organizations operating in the West Bank and Gaza (listing names, addresses, main activities), as well as a full day-to-day planner (calendar) for the year, and a comprehensive compilation of facts and figures related to Palestine and the Palestinians. PASSIA is very proud to say that its diary has become an invaluable source of information for many people, both locally and abroad, and as yet there is no equivalent publication in Palestine.



The PASSIA Diary is divided into three sections - the Calendar, the Directory, and the Agenda:

Calendar

The first section of the Diary includes all the standard features of a calendar, such as a day by-day planner, calendars for the previous and following years, address and note space, and anniversaries and national holidays of foreign countries. In each calendar page, the 2022 edition includes informative textboxes on popular Palestinian musicians and QR Code links to samples of their music.



Directory:

The second part of the Diary contains the Directory listing Palestinian and international institutions operating in the Palestinian Territories as well as selected Arab and Israeli organizations located in Israel. Entries include names of contact persons, phone and fax numbers, e-mail and mailing addresses, websites, and a few keywords describing an organization's main field of work. 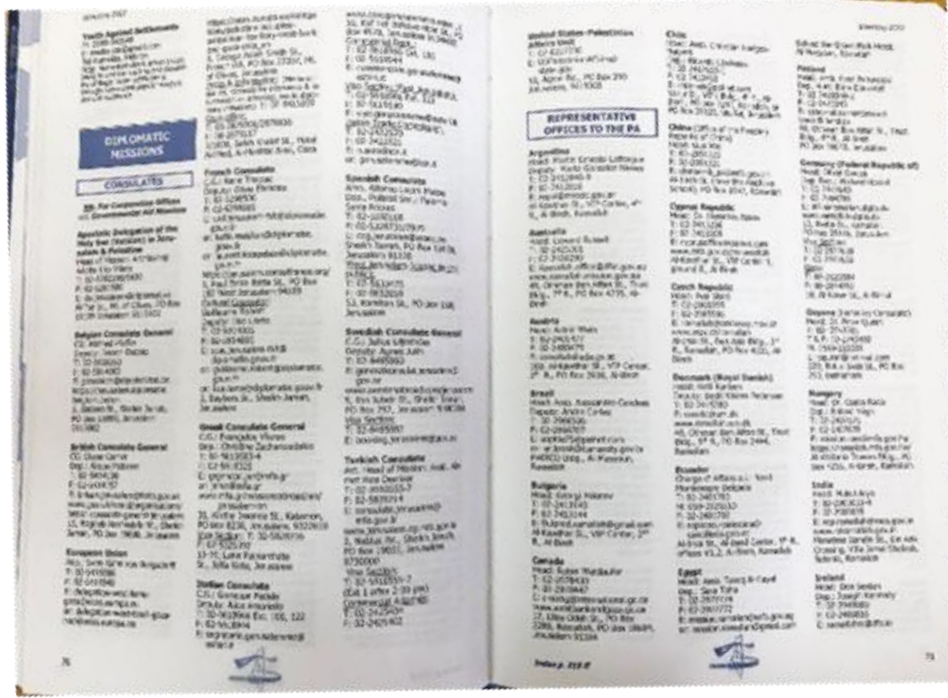

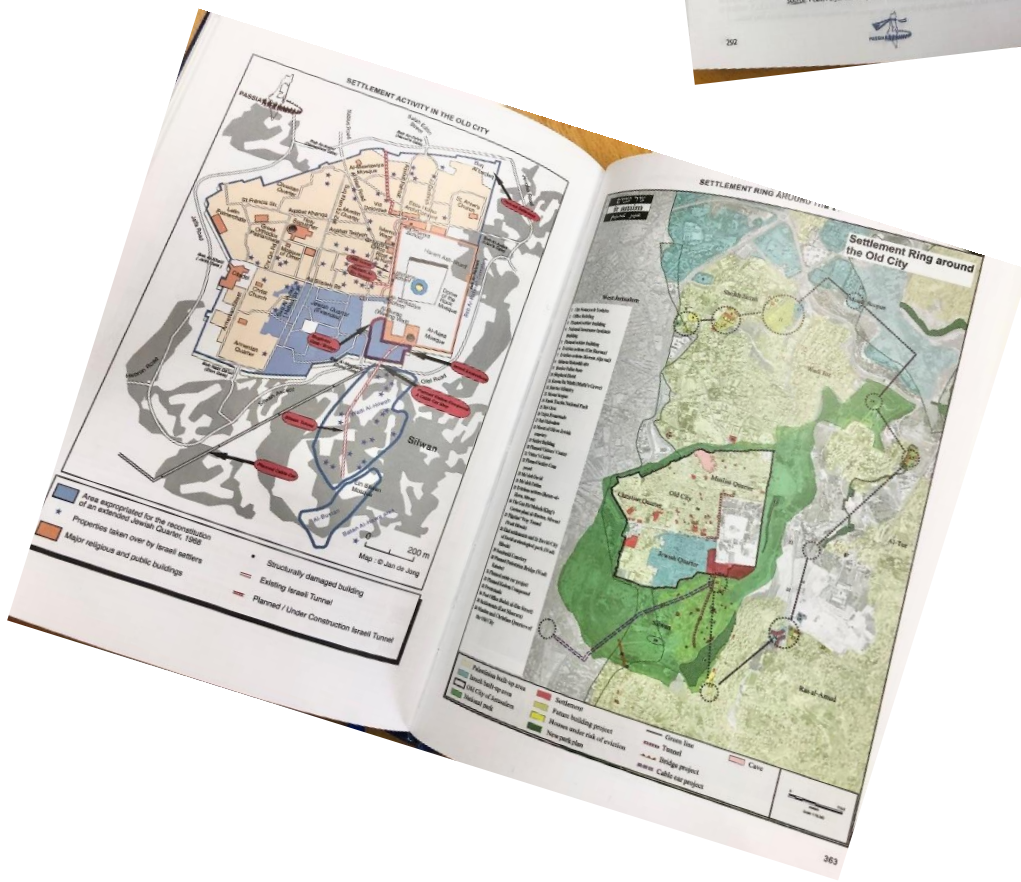
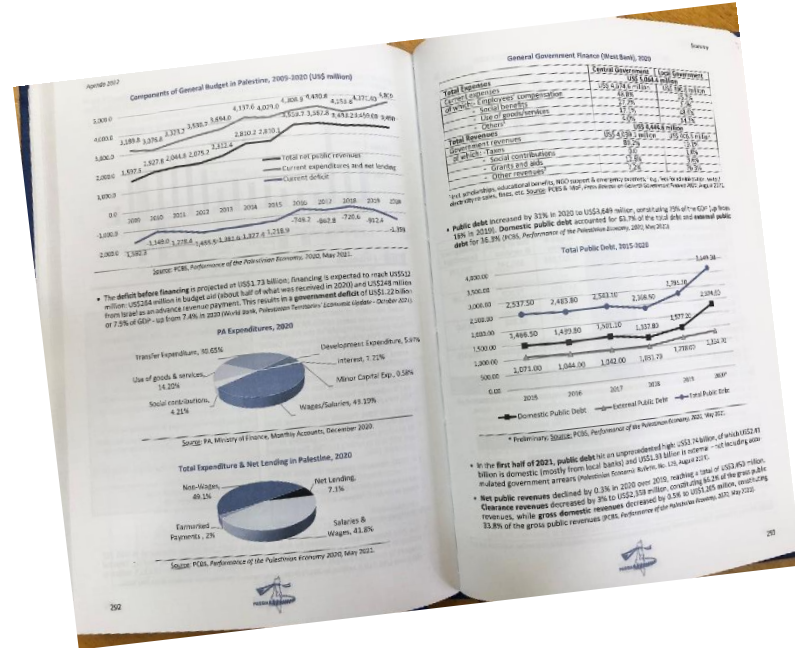
