Health

The **right to health** is a basic, universal human right upheld in the WHO Constitution (1946), the Declaration of Alma Ata (1978), the World Health Assembly (1998), the International Covenant for Economic, Social and Cultural Rights (Art. 12), and in General Comment 14 by the Committee on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights. Yet, the Palestinian health sector suffers from its **dependency on Israel** in terms of tax transfers, authorization of medical personnel, import of medicines, access and movement restrictions for patients, personnel and ambulances, and construction/rehabilitation of health infrastructure, which have resulted in a **shortage** of medications, equipment, personnel, and funding.




- Health services are provided by public (Ministry of Health and Ministry of Interior) and private bodies (hospitals, clinics) as well as NGOs, incl. UNRWA. As of June 2022, the health sector **employed 4.6%** of the work force (WB: 4.3%, GS: 5.2%) (PCBS, *Labor Force Survey*, Q2-2022).
- By mid-2022, Health and Social Work contributed **4.5**% to the **GDP** (excl. East Jerusalem) (WB: 3.5%, GS: 8.7%) (PCBS, Quarterly National Accounts, Q2-2022).
- In 2020, **health expenditure** totaled NIS 2.32 billion (=14.4% of the total PA budget), of which 38.5% was for salaries and wages, 56.3% for use of goods and services, and only 1.1% for development (Palestinian Ministry of Finance, monthly report for December 2021).
- In 2021, the PA Ministry of Health issued a total of **99,064 referrals** (up from 80,020 in 2020) for **51,057 single patients** to specialist facilities not available in the public system. Of the total referrals,10.2% were to facilities **outside the WBGS**, mainly to **Israel** (5.2%) and **Egypt** (3.7%), and Jordan (1.3%), while 47.7% were sent to facilities in the **West Bank**, 37.6% to **East Jerusalem**, and 4.5% to the **Gaza Strip** (Ministry of Health, *Health Annual Report Palestine 2021*, June 2022).

Gaza Patients Permit Applications



- Between 2007-22, 30% of patients who requested to leave the Gaza Strip for healthcare were **rejected or delayed** and 839 patients **died while waiting for a permit** (PHR, *15 Years of Gaza Blockade*, 2022).
- Between 2008-2021, **839 patients died** while waiting for permit responses (WHO, 15 Years of Gaza Blockade & Barriers to Health Access, Infographic, 2022).



- The number of **Palestinian minors** who Israel **refused** to allow **to leave** Gaza for treatment has doubled from 17% in 2020 (347 out of 2,070 requests) to nearly 32% in **2021** (812 of 2,578). The refusal rate for parents' applications to accompany their children increased from 28% to 35% (*Ibid.*).
- In 2020, 79% of the Palestinian population had a **health insurance** (government: 32%, UNRWA: 15%, government & UNRWA: 29%, private: 2%, others: 1.9%) (PCBS, *Press Release on International Population Day*, 11 July 2020).
- In 2021, there were 169 incidents of violence against or obstruction of health care (a 177% increase over 2020), in which, inter alia, 61 health workers were injured and 30 facilities damaged or destroyed (OPT: Violence Against Health Care in Conflict 2021, Safeguarding Health in Conflict Coalition, 2022). In the first half of 2022, 88 attacks on health care happened, leaving 71 health workers injured, 4 detained, and 10 vehicles damaged (WHO, Health Attacks in the Occupied Palestinian Territory, 1/1-30/6 2022).
- Between 5 March 2020 and 15 September 2022, there were 702,768 confirmed cases of Covid-19 in Palestine, including 82,220 in occupied East Jerusalem, 5,707 people had died, and 2,011,491 people got vaccinated with at least one jab (https://www.corona.ps/).

- In 2021, the main leading cause of deaths in Palestine were cardiovascular disease (WB: 23.7%; GS: 29.3%) and Covid-19 (WB: 25.2%; GS: 24%), followed by cancer (WB: 12.2%; GS: 11.3%) (Ministry of Health, Health Annual Report Palestine 2021, 2022).
- 87% of women aged 15-49 years use means of **family planning** and 95% received **prenatal health care** at least four times during pregnancy (PCBS, Press *Release on International Population Day*, 11 July 2022).
