

# Facts & Figures

After using the Jordanian and Egyptian curricula since 1967, the Palestinians' first own national curriculum was launched in 2000. On 6 April 2017, the first Palestinian Law for Education and Higher Education was ratified to make way for a reformed education system based on enrooting and developing knowledge, instead of traditional rote learning and indoctrination. The restructured curriculum was introduced in the 2017/18 school year, incorporating new (e.g., time management, presentation, leadership) and vocational (e.g., in the fields of IT, environment, hospitality) skills.




Education System: Early childhood education starts at the age of 3 or 4; in 2020, 63.8% of children were enrolled in pre-elementary education (boys: 59%, girls: 68.6%) (PCBS, Press Release on International Women's Day, 8 March 2022). Compulsory basic education covers 10 years (grades 1-10) in a common education system, divided into the *Preparation Stage* (grades 1-4) and the *Empowerment Stage* (grades 5 to 10). Secondary Education (grades 11 and 12), which is not obligatory, is separated into a *literary* or a *science* stream and has also a few vocational secondary schools offering courses in commerce, agriculture, technology, industry, and hospitality. Grade 12 ends with the <u>General Secondary Educational Certification</u> exam (*Tawjihi*), which needs to be passed in order to enroll into universities and colleges. In 2022, 85,302 students took the exam, of which 58,107 (68.12%) passed. By branches: Scientific 80.2% passed, Literary 59.6%, Entrepreneurship & Business 62%, Industry 73.5%, Agriculture 82.3%, Legal 53.8%, and Home Economics 41.7 (https://tawjihi.mohe.ps/).




#### **Education System in Palestine\***

- School enrollment in Palestine is above the averages of both the MENA region and of upper middle-income countries (World Bank, West Bank and Gaza SERATAC Project Information Document, Feb. 2022).
- The **illiteracy rate** in Palestine is with 2.3% low. For comparison: the average in the Arab world is 27% and in the MENA region 20% (https://data.worldbank.org/indicator/SE.ADT.LITR.ZS?view=chart&locations=ZQ).

- By mid-2022, education contributed **6.6%** to the **GDP** (excluding Jerusalem) (PCBS, *Quarterly National Accounts*, Q2-2022) and **employed 11.8%** of the work force (WB: 11.3%, GS: 12.9%) (PCBS, *Labor Force Survey*, Q2-2022).
- In 2021, education expenditure totaled NIS 3.14 billion (=19.5% of the total PA budget), of which 80.2% was for salaries and wages, and only 3.7% for development (Ministry of Finance, monthly report for December 2021).
- In 2020/2021, the total **drop-out rate** was 0.79% (girls: 0.46%, boys: 1.13%; WB: 0.86%, GS: 0.71%). It was higher in secondary (2.23%) than in basic stage (0.45%) (Ministry of Education, 2021/2022 Statistics).

- In 2021, 63.3% of students completed 12 years of schooling (WB: 61.2%, GS: 66.8%; females: 75.3%, male: 52.2%), while 7% did not complete any stage of education (males: 6%, females: 9%) (PCBS, *Education Statistics; Press Release on International Population Day*, 11 July 2022).
- In Palestine, the rate of the 18–29-year-olds who are **not in education, employment or training** is high (50% in 2021; WB: 41%; GS: 64%) and with a clear gender difference: 66% for women compared to 34% for men (PCBS, *Press Release on International Youth Day*, 2022).
- In 2021/2022, 77.5% of all schools had a **library**, 78% a **computer lab**, 75.5% a **science lab**, and 75.7% had **counselors** (averaging 546 students per counselor) (Ministry of Education, 2020/2021 Statistics).
- Of the total 3,142 schools, 376 had an evening shift attended by 315,365 students (99.7% in Gaza) (Ibid.).
- In 2021, there were 183 education-related incidents (a 50% increase over 2020) directly affecting 12,070 students and 501 teachers/school staff and causing prolonged loss of learning for 601,914 students. Incidents included detention/arrests, army entering schools, firing tear gas canisters, stun grenades and/or bullets, settler intimidation, delays at checkpoints and denial of access, demolition of schools and infrastructure (OPT Education Cluster, Education-Related Incidents in oPt Annual Report 2021).

# Higher Education

- In 2021, 5.9% of the Palestinian (15+ years) gained an **Associate Diploma** (WB: 4.9%, GS: 7.5%; females: 6%, male: 5.8%) and 17.4% a **BA or above** (WB: 16.7%, GS: 18.5%, f: 19.2%, m: 15.6%) (PCBS, *Education Statistics*).
- Post-secondary/tertiary education is offered in universities, university colleges (mainly 4-year programs), and community colleges (mainly 2-year diploma courses in technical and commercial fields). Currently, 54 institutions offer higher education (Ministry of Higher Education, https://www.mohe.pna.ps/).
- In 2021/2022, some 60,000 new students enrolled in higher education institutions (approx. 60% of them females), bringing the number of total enrolled students to 225,975 (61.5% females) (*Ibid.*).
- Most students are enrolled in **Business & Administration** (27.5%), followed by **Education** (13.4%) and **Health** (11.6%). (PCBS, *Educational fields and labor market among individuals aged (20-29 years) in 2021*, July 2022).

# Vocational Education & Training

After 10<sup>th</sup> grade, a small (but growing) number of Palestinian students choose the **Technical and Vocational Education and Training** (TVET) track for grades 11-12. Major branches are **industry**, **agriculture**, **home economics**, and **hotel management**, with a total of 30 streams (e.g., mechatronics, electricity, design, carpentry, food processing, hospitality, and cosmetics). In 2019, there were some 300 **TVET institutions** (243 vocational training centers, 39 vocational secondary schools, and 30 technical colleges), in which 71,000 students and trainees were enrolled 72% of them in technical college. Women accounted for 33% of the total (*The Technical Vocational Education and Training Sector in Palestine (TVET)*, Special issue of This Week in Palestine, September 2022). However, TVET **enrolment** remains low with only 538 11-12<sup>th</sup> graders enrolled in the 2019/20 academic year, mostly boys (UNDP, *Support to Technical and Vocational Education and Training in East Jerusalem*, 2020).

**Transition into the labor market:** annually, close to 40,000 students graduate from tertiary education institutions (female: 63%; male: 37%). Of these, about two-thirds enter the **labor force** (female: 52.3%; male: 81.6%), but face high **unemployment** rates, especially among Humanities graduates, mainly because of the low absorptive capacity of the private sector and a skills mismatch (World Bank, *West Bank and Gaza SERATAC - Project Information Document*, Feb. 2022). In **2021**, there were 41,137 graduates, but only about 9,000 job opportunities in the local market. Most students are enrolled in **Business and Administration** (27.5%), followed by **Education** (13.4%) and **Health** (11.6%). On average, it takes graduates 11-21 months before getting their first labor chance (PCBS, *Press Release on Educational fields and labor market among individuals aged (20-29 years) in 2021*, July 2022).
