1. INTRODUCTION



April 2024 (Updated Edition)

While "security arrangements" were one of the issues deferred to the so-called permanent status negotiations, the September 1993 Declaration of Principles on Interim Self-Government Arrangements and the subsequent Oslo I and Oslo II Accords provided for a police force to maintain public order and internal security in the territories handed over to the Palestinian Authority (PA). Since then, the Palestinian Authority Security Forces (PASF) have undergone numerous reform processes in line with political developments and changes in leadership and security policies, but the focus remained on internal law and order and the assurance of Israel – rather than Palestinian – security. This dilemma of symbolizing independence through arms and uniforms on the one hand, but lacking the necessary authority and jurisdiction on the other, has created a great potential for conflict from the outset and led to a situation in which "the civilian population of Palestine, whether living directly or indirectly under Israel's military occupation in the West Bank and Gaza, is one of the least protected populations in the world."¹

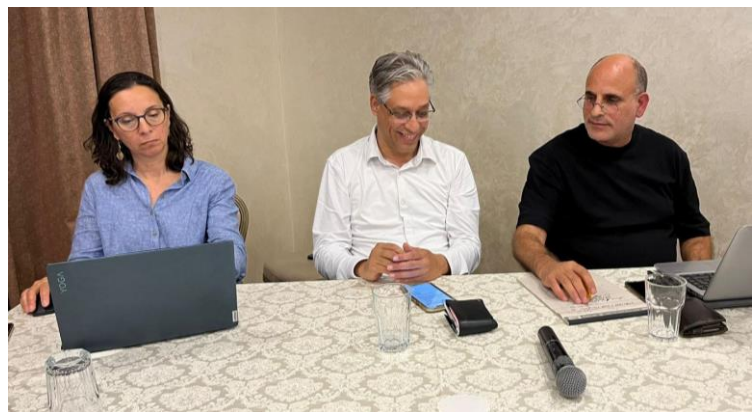

AL-AQSA MOSQUE: A Palestinian Perspective

Factsheet on Al-Aqsa Mosque compound/Haram Ash-Sharif, summarizing recent Israeli violations, the sensitive issue of Ramadan 2024, and PASSIA in-house discussions, talking points and policy recommendations.

AL-AQSA MOSQUE: A PALESTINIAN PERSPECTIVE

GENERAL BACKGROUND

Al-Aqsa Mosque/Al-Haram Ash-Sharif holds immense religious, historical and cultural significance for Muslims worldwide. For Palestinians, it also has symbolic significance which highlights the interplay between religion, politics, and territorial control. In recent years, it has increasingly become a flashpoint in the Israeli-Palestinian conflict with frequent tension and clashes as it faces unprecedented threats by Israeli attempts aimed at altering its status and control, and even allowing non-Muslim prayer there.

To avoid further violence and escalation, Israeli violations must be addressed and the protection of this holy site ensured, with adherence to international law and an international commitment to upholding the rights and freedoms of Palestinians.

ISRAELI VIOLATIONS AT AL-AQSA MOSQUE

- **Restricted Access and Freedom of Worship:**
 - Israeli authorities frequently impose age and residency-based restrictions on Palestinian worshippers, particularly during significant Islamic events like Ramadan, or Jewish holidays.
 - On many occasions, checkpoints and police deployment in and around the Old City of Jerusalem hinder Palestinians from accessing Al-Aqsa, violating their freedom of worship. After October 7, 2023, Palestinians were completely banned from entering Al-Aqsa Mosque, with the exception of residents of the Old City. That situation was not relaxed until the beginning of Ramadan, five months later. On Eid Al-Adha in June 2024, Israeli police, border police and special forces beat youth entering to make Eid prayers at the mosque with batons.
 - At the same time, groups of Jewish extremists (settlers) escorted by Israeli police enter the Al-Aqsa compound and provocatively tour the site, often – illegally – attempting to pray or actually doing so, leading to tensions and confrontations with Palestinian worshippers.

DIALOGUE PROGRAM

Since its establishment in 1987, PASSIA’s Dialogue Program has been dedicated to fostering open discussion within Palestinian society and enhancing understanding of Palestinian affairs in both domestic and international contexts. By providing a platform for dialogue and exchange, PASSIA has played a pivotal role in encouraging civic debate and engagement.

At the core of these efforts is the exploration and analysis of diverse Palestinian perspectives on a broad range of issues related to the Palestine Question. This is achieved through roundtable discussions, expert briefings, and media engagements. Roundtable meetings serve as a key component of this initiative, where invited speakers—and at times designated discussants—deliver lectures on critical topics, followed by in-depth discussions with attendees. These meetings are designed to stimulate thoughtful debate among Palestinians and to facilitate dialogue between Palestinian and international participants. To accommodate a wider audience, many of these discussions take place in venues such as hotel halls.

Speakers, discussants, and participants represent a broad spectrum of perspectives and expertise, including scholars, professionals, policymakers, and intellectuals from Palestine, Israel, and beyond. Additionally, representatives from Palestinian NGOs, political factions, the media, and diplomatic missions actively contribute to the discourse, enriching the dialogue with diverse viewpoints.

PASSIA’s briefings further serve as an essential space for meaningful encounters, discussions, and exchanges between individuals and organizations from various backgrounds. These sessions focus on current Palestinian affairs and aim to strengthen understanding about Palestinian perspectives and aspirations. Briefings frequently include meetings with resident diplomats, visiting foreign delegations, and student groups from international universities, fostering discussions on the political, social, and economic realities in the Palestinian Territories. Through these initiatives, PASSIA hopes to bridge gaps, promote informed dialogue, and contribute to a more engaged and connected society.

RELIGIOUS STUDIES UNIT

Established in 1998, PASSIA's Religious Studies Unit was founded in response to the growing need for a deeper and more nuanced understanding of religious issues and the diverse religious communities in the region. Recognizing the critical role that religion plays in shaping social and political dynamics, the unit is dedicated to fostering interfaith dialogue, promoting mutual understanding, and addressing the complex causes and consequences of religious tensions.

A key focus of the unit's work is the intersection of religion and politics, particularly in relation to Jerusalem's sacred sites. Special attention is given to Al-Aqsa Mosque/Al-Haram Al-Sharif, which remains at the heart of religious and political discourse.

Through research, dialogue, and collaboration with scholars, religious leaders, and institutions, the unit seeks to analyze and document the implications of religious conflicts while encouraging constructive engagement between different faith communities.

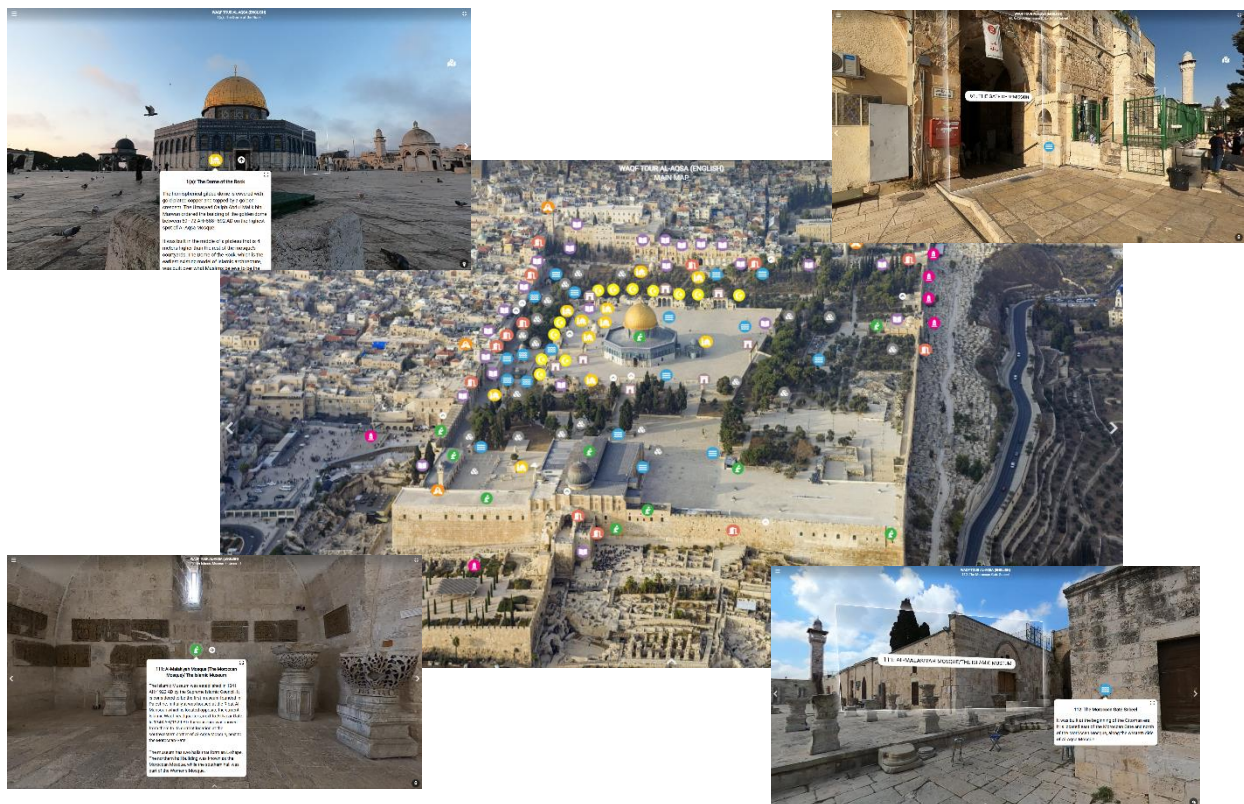

DIGITIZATION OF THE GUIDE TO AL-AQSA MOSQUE/HARAM AL-SHARIF

The Al-Aqsa Mosque/Haram Al-Sharif is one of the most important Islamic sites in Jerusalem and the world. This is not only due to its religious status as one of the three most sacred places for Muslims, but also as a cultural and historical icon and home to numerous important Islamic sites, including the Qibli Mosque, the Dome of the Rock Mosque, the Al-Buraq Wall, and the Marwani Mosque, as well as many more monuments that pertain to different eras of Islamic history.

In order to foster the historical and religious knowledge about these structures and to counter inaccurate information and exclusions promoted by Israel, PASSIA undertook to publish a guide in 2013, providing the Palestinian narrative of all the 137 different buildings, schools, mosques, etc. within the compound. In 2018, PASSIA produced an educational wall poster, displaying an aerial view of the compound and numbering and naming all its structures.

In 2023-2024, PASSIA embarked on a new project that involved software design and programming with the aim to digitize the poster and guide book in order to create an interactive educational tool. This displays an overview map of the Al-Aqsa Mosque/Haram Al-Sharif and allows the user to navigate the site and to explore all its various structures, most of them with a 360-degree camera view, and learn about their historical and cultural significance and context.



FOSTERING YOUNG PALESTINIAN JERUSALEMITES ACTIVE CITIZENSHIP TOWARDS MEANINGFUL CIVIL AND POLITICAL PARTICIPATION

This project, which was launched in late 2022, was developed against the background of the living conditions in East Jerusalem which create a context that leaves little perspectives for Palestinians in general and the youth in particular. In addition, while youth constitute a major share of the society and while there is a range of organizations in Jerusalem dedicated to youth work or targeting youth in one way or another, they hardly appear as civic actors and are barely represented in decision-making processes.

Identifying the barriers and obstacles to participation is a prerequisite for a meaningful engagement of young people. The goal of the project was thus to explore the physical, social, cultural and political barriers to youth participation and engagement, particularly within the special context of Jerusalem, and look into the kind of interventions needed to overcome these.

In achieving this, the project:

- provided a forum where youth can share perspectives in constructive dialogue;
- facilitated discussion among youth on issues that affect their social, legal, economic and political status;
- increased the ability of youth to understand and claim their rights as well as advocate for social change in their local communities.

Activities under this project that took place in 2024 included producing the final report which presented the findings from a SWOT analysis and focus group meetings, and the results from questionnaire-based interviews with key informants and youths.

In addition, at the conclusion of the project in 2024, a youth-led symposium on the topics explored in this project was held.

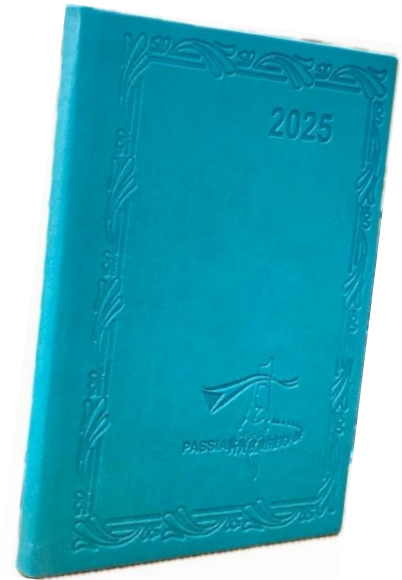

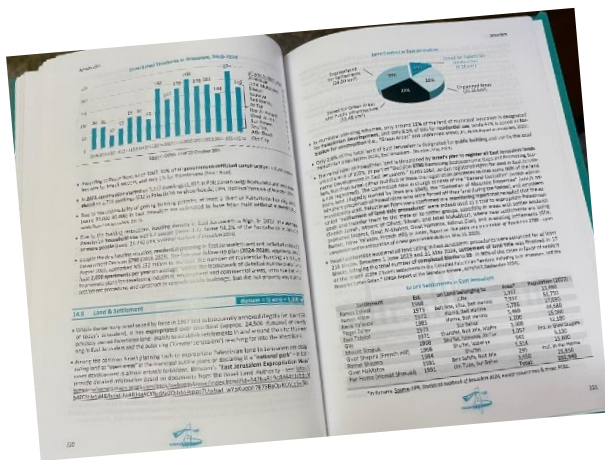

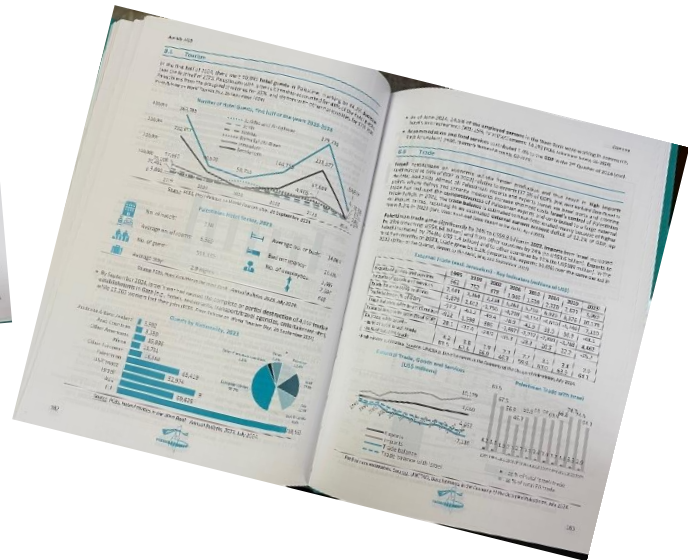
